New Video Thesis Format at E&I

Submission in two parts

1. Part I A written document

Different from a traditional bachelor thesis in two ways:

- o It will not include the usual Discussion and Conclusion parts
- It will include:
 - <u>Video script</u>: A chronological run-down of scenes (dialogue that is to appear in the video)
 - <u>Video storyboard:</u> A graphic representation of how the video will unfold, shot by shot.

The table of contents can be structured as follows:

1. Introduction (approx. 1-2 pages)

- 1.1. Presentation of the topic and the research question
- 1.2. Presentation of its relevance (e.g. for research, teaching, or practice)

2. Literature review (approx. 5-7 pages)

- 2.1. Current state of research
- 2.2. Key insights
 - Describe particularly relevant topic blocks more intensively
 - Refer to and highlight findings from the latest literature

3. Video concept (approx. 10 pages)

- 3.1. Background information
 - Which topic blocks will be featured in the video?
 - What is the choice based on?
- 3.2. Video script
- 3.3. Video storyboard

2. Part II An explainer video

When the supervisor has approved the video script and storyboard, the video can be produced.

All important requirements and tips & tricks for creating an explainer video will be documented in a corresponding explainer video guideline.

An explainer video (2-6min. length)



An efficient combination of visual cues (storyboard based) and audio explanation (video-script based) to convey key information on a particular topic.

These two parts together shall reflect a workload of about 25 full-time working days (200 working hours), worth 8 ECTS for BAWISO and 10 ECTS and a respective workload for BBE students.
